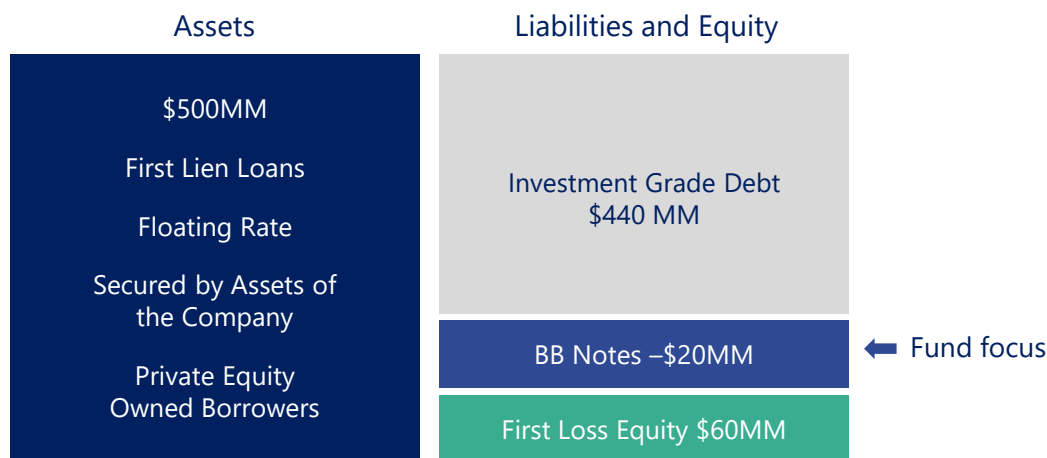

CLO OVERVIEW – A HIGHLY DIVERSIFIED POOL OF LOANS ³



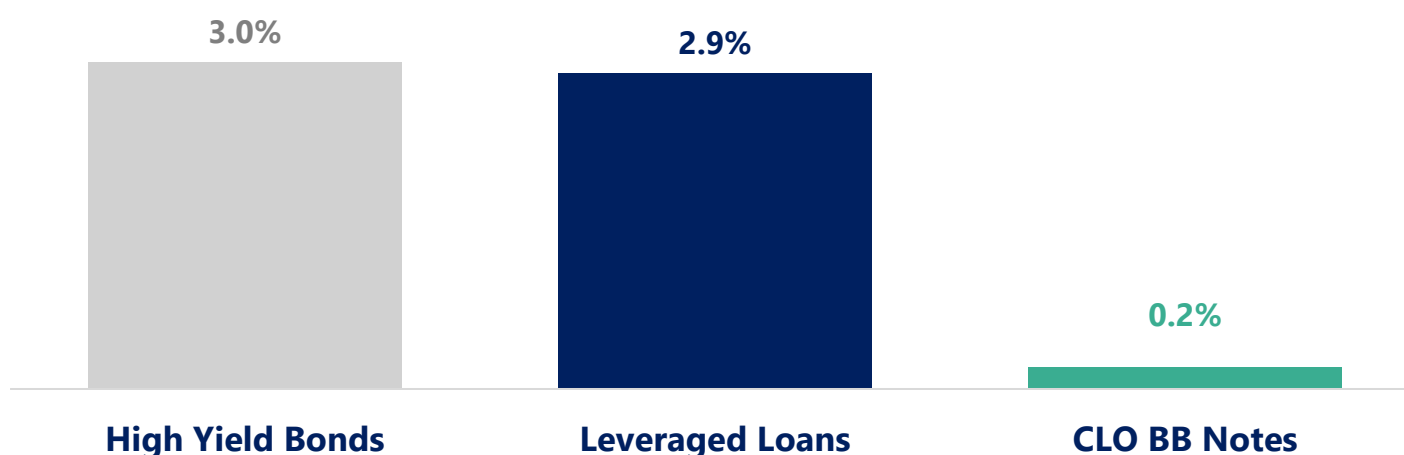

Our shares have no history of public trading, nor is it intended that our shares will be listed on a national securities exchange at this time, if ever. No secondary market is expected to develop for our shares; liquidity for our shares will be provided only through quarterly repurchase offers for no less than 5% of and no more than 25% of our shares at net asset value, and there is no guarantee that an investor will be able to sell all the shares that the investor desires to sell in the repurchase offer. Due to these limited restrictions, an investor should consider an investment in the Fund to be of limited liquidity. Investing in our shares may be speculative and involves a high degree of risk, including the risks associated with leverage. We expect to invest primarily in the junior debt tranches of CLOs that own a pool of Senior Secured Loans made to companies whose debt is rated below investment grade or, in limited circumstances, unrated. We place particular emphasis on CLO debt tranches initially rated ‘BB’ by a NRSRO. To a lesser extent, we may invest in other CLO debt securities, CLO equity or other debt securities as permitted by the Adviser’s allocation policy. Our investments in the equity and junior debt tranches of CLOs are exposed to leveraged credit risk. Investments in the lowest tranches bear the highest level of risk. We may pay distributions in significant part from sources that may not be available in the future and that are unrelated to our performance, such as a returns of capital or borrowing. The amount of distributions that we may pay, if any, is uncertain.

4) There is no guarantee that shareholders will be able to sell; our repurchase offers will be conducted pursuant to a fundamental policy, pursuant to which we intend to offer to repurchase a minimum of 5% of our outstanding shares on a non-discretionary basis once each calendar quarter of each year. Although we will make quarterly repurchase offers, investors should consider our shares to be of limited liquidity.
